No small achievement as we see the devastating impact that continues across the globe.

This year we will be thinking about the recent announcements to the Health and Disability System Review and the opportunities and impacts these changes will have. The is no doubt that as a nation we must address the significant inequities that currently exist.

This is my final President's Report as I have decided to step-down at the AGM. I have enjoyed my time as President, however it's time for a change and I'm sure ACHSM-Aotearoa will be in good hands. During my time as President we have focused on delivering greater value to our members, and it is great to see the number of members who join the monthly journal club and online events.

#### **National Council**

The National Council has met monthly and also met for a planning day in November where our focus has been on the priorities outlined in the strategic plan. The National Council currently has eight members with two members who are seeking re-election.

### **Strategic Plan**

We developed a strategic plan in 2019 to guide us over the next few years. The main focus continues to be building the value we offer to members in New Zealand and promoting health management as a profession.

The key priorities are:

- 1. Recognised as the voice for health managers and leaders
- 2. Provide high value services to members
- 3. Advance the professionalisation of health management

# **Key Achievements**

During the 2020/21 year we have:

1. Developed a monthly Journal club. A big thank you Cathy Cooney and the Midland/South Island group that has developed the journal club. There are great speakers and the sessions are well attended.

- 2. Initiated the mentoring programme in Aotearoa using the ACHSM approach. We have sought members to be both mentors and mentees during 2021.
- 3. Continued to offer a speaker programme via zoom

#### Constitution

Following the agreement to change the name from NZIHM to ACHSM-Aotearoa at the 2020 AGM legal advice was sought on the impact on the Constitution. We were advised that we needed to change the Constitution in order to change the name and this would be a good opportunity to align the Constitution with the Incorporated Societies Act.

A new Constitution was drafted to reflect the purpose of ACHSM-Aotearoa and this was reviewed by our legal advisor prior to being sent to all New Zealand members in late April.

The key changes are:

- a. Reference to Te Tiriti o Waitangi and Maori representation
- b. Adopting the standard clauses that apply to all Incorporated Societies, the impact is some sections and clauses are now significantly shorter.
- c. Adding reference to ACHSM National office who provide services to ACHSM-Aotearoa such as holding the Register of members
- d. Addition of a process for responding to complaints
- e. Addition of clauses relating to conflicts of Interest
- f. Add the role of 'secretary' to the list of officers.
- g. Changing the quorum for AGM from 15 members to 15% of members
- h. Winding up. A three step process. Recommendation from National Council to wind-up, smple majority vote at AGM or Special General Meeting and 51% agreement from all members
- i. Requirement of President to be a Fellow of the College
