Two Council members have signalled their intent to step down at this AGM:

Karen Orsborn FCHSM, the immediate past President, who has served for nine years.

Charmaine Pene FCHSM, who has served three years. I acknowledge that while Karen was President she led the process to update the Constitution; the adoption of the new name ACHSM – Aotearoa; a move to a stronger strategic focus; and the development of a new

agreement with ACHSM for greater collaboration and operational support reflected through an updated Memorandum of Understanding (eventually signed at the Perth Congress in 2022 due to Covid cancellations of the 2020 and 2021 events).

I also acknowledge Charmaine's contribution to our new name, the whakatauki and the brand, and to how we continue to grow in becoming more Tiriti based in the way we advance the College.

We extend our sincerest thanks to both Karen and Charmaine for their leadership contribution to the College during their time on Council.

As a result of Karen and Charmaine stepping down we have sought nominations for two new Council members at this AGM.

# **Strategic Plan**

At the 23 November 2022 planning day we had a focus on how we position our strategic influence; more clearly state how we work in a more Tiriti o Waitangi honouring way; and we considered ways to demystify how members navigate the different pathways of the College and the journey from student or member to associate fellow and fellow.

We reconfirmed that the focus for Council continues to be building the value we offer to you our members and to promoting leadership and management knowledge, skill and competence in the health and disability sectors.

# **Some Key Achievements**

During the 2022/23 year we have:

- Continued to offer a monthly online interactive Journal Club free to Aotearoa members. A big thank you Veronique Gibbons and the Journal Club Working Group. An average of 20+ members register for each event. A reminder that Journal Club is held every month between February – November, last Wednesday of the month, 4.30-5.30pm - attendance at the Journal Club attracts 1 CPD point each time.
- 2. Meeting with Fepulea'i Margie Apa to explain about the College and seek an opportunity to partner with Te Whatu Ora and Te Aka Whai Ora in the advancement of health leadership and management. We explained how the College can support members on the health leadership and management career pathway and we encouraged Margie to seek our input and not replicate the effort on such developments as a Competency Framework when we have a current evidenced based framework in use.
- 3. Continued to run the certification and mentoring programmes in Aotearoa with the ACHSM providing administrative support.
- 4. Developed a 'Post Card' for promoting ACHSM Aotearoa
- 5. Updated the Common Seal and President's Chain to reflect the new ACHSM Aotearoa name and logo.
- 6. Reviewed and updated the Silver Fern Award criteria for nominations, the application form and the certificate.



- 7. Developed a graphic "Leadership Career Pathway" as a way to explain about the wide range of programmes and ways the College can support members on their career journey. This pathway will be launched at the AGM.
- 8. Continued to promote the new brand and logo to represent our name ACHSM Aotearoa; and the video to reflect the brand story <a href="https://youtu.be/q0l8lmAQ\_AY">https://youtu.be/q0l8lmAQ\_AY</a>
- 9. Published quarterly e-newsletters from the National Council to members.
- 10. Input to Phase 1 of the Manatū Hauora project on clinical leadership in the policy setting.

- 11. Working with a NZ University regarding ACHSM accreditation of their post graduate health leadership and health management programmes. ACHSM have introduced a new policy that any student undertaking an accredited PG programme of study will be eligible for free ACHSM membership.
- 12. Grew membership by 18 over the year. (approx 19% increase)

# Fellowship

We have four fellowship candidates for 2023 with the oral examination to be held virtually prior to the Canberra 11-13 October Congress.

Congratulations also to the 2022 Fellowship cohort who had a 100% success rate.



Of the Fellowship awardees at the Perth Congress – a number of the group had been waiting 2+ years for this award ceremony due to Covid disruption to prior congresses.

We sincerely appreciate the time, support, and guidance our Fellowship Coordinator, Dr Jagpal Benipal gives to Fellowship candidates with 2-4 weekly study group sessions across a 6+ month period.
